


Greenshaw Learning Trust (GLT) and the Department for Education track attendance carefully and judgements on how well a school is doing is partially based on whole school attendance.

Pupils Safety - Walking Home

We have been made aware of an incident that took place at the beginning of this year on Cotelands, located at the back of our school field, whereby a sibling of one of our pupils was assaulted and had their mobile phone stolen. Due to the fact the incident happened around 4pm in the afternoon. We want to remind all families and the community to be vigilant and for those pupils permitted to walk home unsupervised to walk with a friend whenever possible.

This incident was reported to the police, however, we are aware this is becoming an increasingly common crime in Croydon. Thank you for ongoing support as a school and a wider community.


Main Office Gate Reminder

Whilst schools continue to work on reasoning and problem-solving, we are continuously always looking at ways to support children (and their parents/carers) with strengthening number work.



What is Fluency in Maths?

Fluency in maths is about developing number sense and being able to use the most appropriate method for the task at hand; to be able to apply a skill to multiple contexts.

The National Curriculum states that pupils should become fluent in the fundamentals of mathematics through varied and frequent practice. While a part of this is about knowing key mathematical facts and recalling them efficiently, fluency means so much more than this as it allows pupils to delve much deeper.
